George Giacomakis is one of Cal State Fullerton's most popular history professors, and head of the university's Irvine branch campus. He earned his doctorate in Near Eastern and Mediterranean studies at Brandeis where he learned to read in five languages. He served for six years as president and executive director at Jerusalem University College in Israel and was director of the American Institute of Holy Land Studies. He translated the New Testament into English and is working on the Old Testament.
