Who are the staff?

For the past 28 years, The Bureau of Jewish Education of Orange County has been conducting the Adat Noar program. The Bureau employs some of the finest teachers and counselors in southern California. Most of our staff attended insight into working with the students and a unique commitment to the program.

Sunday sessions hold a 1:20 teacher to student ratio and camp weekends hold a 1:4 counselor to camper ratio.

Where is the camp? How do we get there?

All of our Shabbaton weekends are held at Brandeis-Bardin Institute in Simi Valley. The campground is on 3,000 acres of land. The facility is Glatt Kosher and is gate and guard secured 24-hours a day.

On the Friday of camp, students may take our chartered coach bus from Irvine, Santa Ana or Long Beach. If students are unable to ride the bus from one of our three bus stops, s/he may be driven to camp by a parent or guardian with pre-approval from our Youth Staff.

What Are the Fees?



The total cost is shared four ways:

- 1. \$295 is provided by sponsoring congregations to which your family belongs;
- 2. \$295 is provided by the Jewish Federation of Orange County or Long Beach;
- 3. \$645 is provided by the Bureau of Jewish Education of Orange County
- 4. \$750 is your family's portion of this fee

If you are a member of a non-sponsoring congregation, you may be able participate, but your family will be responsible for the \$295 congregation payment in addition to the family payment.

Over 700 students come through the Bureau programs each year. Every student, staff member and board member learns about five core values: *Kavod* - Respect, *Hesed* - Kindness, *Talmud Torah* - Jewish Learning, *Haknessat Orkhim* - Welcoming the Guest, *K'lal Yisrael* - Community.
